Leadership Trait of the Month - Social Intelligence

Social intelligence refers to the ability to understand your own and others' feelings and emotions and then to use this understanding to inform your decisions and actions. Socially/emotionally intelligent people solve interpersonal problems quickly by understanding what is upsetting others and being empathetic to these concerns. They tend to recognize when they've said something that made someone uncomfortable and know what makes others "tick." Socially/emotionally intelligent people are able to thrive in many different relationships and settings because they quickly learn the social rules.

We can support children in developing social/emotional intelligence by encouraging them to:

- Find positive solutions to conflicts/problems
- Care about the feelings of others
- Be flexible when working in groups
- Make and maintain friendships

CURRICULUM

Creek View will be administering the IOWA test to all $3^{\rm rd}$ and $5^{\rm th}$ graders between October 21-25, 2019. During this time no parent visitors/volunteers will be allowed in the building. This does include lunch visitors as well. We appreciate your help as we work together as a school to create an optimum testing environment for students.

Reading and Language Arts

This month students will begin their Unit 2 of the Reading Units of Study. In this unit students will be learning how to become a word detective by first monitoring their reading and realizing when they get into trouble with tricky words. Then they will use their detective strategies to help them solve the tricky word. Students will also be focusing on their sight words in this unit and should be expected to know around fifty sight words. Lastly, students will be learning about challenging phonics skills and how these can help us break the words into smaller chunks.

Phonics– Blends, Magic E, Long Vowels, Soft C and G **Grammar**– Plural Nouns, Possessive Nouns, Articles, Adjectives, and Complete Sentences

Mathematics- Unit 2 "Developing Base Ten Number Sense" and "Data/Graphing"

- Ordering numbers least to greatest
- Find missing numbers on a number line.
- Skip counting by 10s
- Hundreds Chart to 120
- Making groups of 10 in order to count
- 10 more 10 less

- Estimation
- Place Value Hundreds, Tens, and Ones
- Data can be represented in multiple ways
- Important information can be found in representations such as tables and graphs.
- Data can be organized in multiple ways
- Graphs are a way to represent data.

Science- Weather

Social Studies-Ben Franklin/ Lewis & Clark Expedition

Science:

- Explain how tools are used to measure the weather (thermometer, rain gauge, wind vane)
- Describe the seasons and how the weather changes with each season
- Recording the weather each day
- Explain the different parts of the water cycle

Social Studies:

- Read about and describe the life of historical figures in American history.
- Describe the cultural and geographical systems associated with Ben Franklin.
- Identify goods people make and services people provide for one another.
- Explain that people make choices about goods and services because of scarcity
- Describe how people are both producers and consumers.
